#### Position: Director



## **By-Law Change**

After some discussion the Club's Executive Board has voted to propose a change to section 3(b) of the by-laws. This change will result in lower fees for first-time members who join between the beginning of July and the end of September. We feel that they shouldn't have to pay a full-year's membership when more than half of the year's meetings have already been held. Those who join between October and December will become members in the following year.

Section 3(b) currently reads:

Membership renewals are due by the January general meeting. Anyone becoming a first-time member between September and December will be a paid-up member for the following year.

The following motion will be made at the September meeting, and voted on at the November Annual General Meeting:

Section 3(b) of the by-laws shall be changed to:

Membership renewals are due by the January general meeting. Anyone becoming a first-time member between October and December will be a paid-up member for the following year. The fees for any new first-time member joining between July 1 and September 30 shall be half of the regular fees.
